Overview of Role

The Teacher of English Language B/ ESL is a collaborative member of the Faculty of Languages and responsible for the teaching of English Language B/ ESL and English in Secondary School to include:

IB Diploma Standard and Higher Level English Language B; International GCSE ESL: Middle School English; support with 'Language Lab' teaching as required

Job Description & Duties

Instruction

The English Language B/ ESL teacher is expected to provide quality instruction for the students at ERV in accordance with the school's established curriculum, school policies and expectations. ERV teachers:

- Actively realise the full potential of each student and promote ideals of excellence
- Establish a well-managed learning environment where active, individual learning and progress for all students is the norm
- Prepare and plan lessons in accordance with the school curriculum and maintain a schedule of lessons to be taught using an annual programme overview and unit plans
- Submit planning, attendance and assessment records to the relevant Coordinator and/or Head of Secondary as required
- Test, evaluate and monitor students' effort and achievement in accordance with the school's established assessment and grading procedures and adjust teaching strategies accordingly
- Set and mark homework on a regular basis, ensuring that qualitative and quantitative feedback is given to individual students
- Utilise non-teaching time during the school day for professional duties which include, but are not limited to, lesson planning, parent conferences, departmental meetings, marking, student meetings and breaktime duties
- Be familiar with student past academic records and address individual student needs as necessary. Contribute to the development of the school curriculum
- Monitor, advise and assist in the pastoral care of students
- Report student illness, accident or injury to the School Office or administration
- Develop professional practice by attending educational workshops; reviewing professional publications; establishing personal networks; and participating in professional societies

School Organisation

The English Language B/ ESL teacher is expected to work in a positive, professional, supportive manner and develop a collaborative and team approach to enable the school to achieve its stated philosophy and specific goals. Teachers will:

- Be familiar with all school and Faculty procedures as appropriate
- Play a key role in the Faculty of Languages to include the administration and effective development of English language teaching and activities, including for the 'Language Lab' (beginner) learners as required
- Attend appropriate Faculty meetings and collaborative planning sessions
- Participate in professional development and in-service activities, organised by the school
- Set annual professional teaching goals in line with the department and school planning
- Maintain an up-to-date attendance register and records of assessment for classes
- Keep up to date on information from administration; check mailboxes daily
- Conduct school business at all times in a professional and ethical manner.
- Assist the administration and subject colleagues in covering classes and duties
- Undertake additional responsibilities as reasonably requested by the administration

School Community

The English Language B/ ESL teacher is expected to view the role of parents in the learning process as important. Good parent/school relationships should be promoted and fostered.







- Understand and be supportive of the diversity of the school community and student's family background
- Work in a positive, cooperative and supportive way with students, parents, co-workers and other stakeholders
- Regularly attend community events and meetings with parents to discuss student progress. These include Parent Teacher Conferences, Orientation Programmes, school graduation ceremonies and other community events
- Keep effective records of student learning, including preparing termly Reports to Parents
- Support the school in any way reasonably requested by the school leadership team

Skills Required

- Appropriate Degree, preferably with Hons, or with PGCE or BEd
- Qualified Teacher Status; candidates with DELTA (or equivalent) and appropriate International/Secondary School experience will be considered
- Excellent understanding of curriculum and pedagogical issues relating to their subject/relevant age range
- Minimum 2 years experience of teaching young people
- Excellent subject knowledge
- Successful experience of delivering International GCSE and/or IB Diploma curriculum
- Clear understanding of the assessment procedures with the curriculum/phase
- Excellent written skills
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- ICT Literate
- Professional and genuine care for the wellbeing of children
- Ability to work as part of a team and contribute towards reaching common goals
- Flexible and adaptable
- Internationally minded and willing to contribute to the wider school curriculum (ECAs)
- Positive, patient and with a sense of humour
